the Campaign Continues

The demand for a public inquiry into the murder of Human Rights lawyer Pat Finucane has never been more compelling post the recent meeting in Downing St. The clear reversal by David Cameron has simply determined the resolve of the Finucane family and emboldened the public spirit, including all of those affected by the policy of collusion, to support the Finucane family in their campaign.

This public event will allow people to express their support and solidarity with the Finucane family and to hear directly from Geraldine Finucane of recent events and of their on-going campaign. Also speaking will be Alex Maskey who will address his own experiences of being targeted by the British army's Force Research Unit (FRU), the MI5 military intelligence group that ran the key agent and UDA/UFF chief intelligence officer Brian Nelson, who was also involved in planning Pat's murder. A number of failed assassination bids were made on Alex during his time as an elected representative on Belfast City Council. In one attack Alex was shot, and in a separate attack on his home a close friend Alan Lundy was murdered.

Legal representatives for the Finucane family will also address the current legal position and the discussions between the family's lawyers and the British government that led to the Downing St. meeting. Relatives for Justice (RFJ) will chair the event.

David Cameron has now acknowledged that collusion took place in the murder of Pat Finucane and the only way forward in terms of properly addressing the full extent of that collusion is to hold a public inquiry.

As the Finucane family have so often said an inquiry into the murder of Pat is not just about one man - it is about a policy that affected so many people across our society and that devastated so many lives and which needs to be comprehensively addressed.

As Geraldine said; 'an inquiry would be a force for good for so many people'

This event will allow the Finucane family to discuss the case - the central issues - the legalities - and to continue their connection with the hundreds of other bereaved families also struggling for truth and justice.

If no one defends human rights lawyers then who is going to defend human rights?'

An inquiry is the only solution.
